## **Faces Have Names**

Jesus says, "You will have the poor with you every day for the rest of your lives. Whenever you 'feel' like it, you can do something for them" (Mark 14:7).

lobal Impact Pastor, Steve Hanson, closes *The Message* and reflects on this Scripture verse and the last 20 years of ministry with Open Door. Then the Spirit impresses a thought on his heart, "I 'feel' like a cup of freshly ground coffee at Starbucks or the thrill of going to a Gopher's basketball game."

Then he wonders, "When do I ever 'feel' like being with the poor?"

His memory travels back to the first time when he went to Haiti, 21 years ago. He said, "The stench of poverty, the dust and filth, was so thick I couldn't wash it off." He saw an endless sea of blank faces that merged together to form a multitude of overwhelming need. He was panged with an unsettling thought, "Poverty from a distance is disparaging."

"I didn't feel like being there," Steve said, "as long as poverty remained at a distance, all I felt was pity. But when I came to know that the faces of poverty have names, I became engaged in their story."







# Jonny Lang? I'm a Fan

### In a Christian marketplace weary with the latest post-modern music professing itself as worship...

onny Lang's most recent recording Turn Around is a welcome reprieve. It is a breath of fresh air in the Christian pop-music induced smog.

I would not classify my musical tastes as inclusive of blues, a genre that Jonny Lang has been affiliated with since his first album at the age of 15. Most of the music on my iPod is along the lines of Pink Floyd, David Crowder, Aimee Mann and everything in-between. With that said, I probably wouldn't have given Lang's latest album more than a passing glance were it not for two things: 1) a friend of mine who just happens to be a sibling of Jonny Lang and 2) myspace. That's right, myspace.

Although now a furious frenzy of "friend" networking and teenage-crazed connectivity, myspace was initially a website that gave bands, artists, and musicians the resources to connect with each other and get their music heard. Yes, I have a myspace, and no, I'm not a teenager. I found the accessible means to music that myspace offers so enticing that I simply had to give in and get one.

In my journeys through the great chasm of myspace networking, I stumbled upon Jonny's myspace and gave a few of the songs from *Turn Around* a healthy listen. All right Jonny Lang, you've got my attention. Call it my love for a decent back beat (and all things Michael Bland), call it my never-ending search for compelling lyrics in a world of cracker box pop music... call it what you will, but one thing is for certain. I am no blues fan and it is with great delight that I tell you, in the certain words of Jack Black, "Jonny Lang? I'm a fan."

As the album's title implies, Jonny has turned around... not musically mind you; he still croons with the voice of a 40-year veteran blues singer, although only a 25-year-old farm boy from North Dakota, and his guitar still sings as it has since Jonny first started playing at the age of 12. What has turned around is Jonny himself, who now boldly professes a renewed faith in God - to the end that Turn Around has been released to both Christian and mainstream audiences.

His musical prowess at such a young age forced Jonny Lang to grow up in plain view of the public and, as Michael Jackson has so colorfully taught us, that can have a precarious outcome. A life riddled with addictions, partying, and

performing was Lang's self-admitted existence. But in recent history, an encounter with God that knocked him off his feet (literally) led Jonny to profess a faith in Christ that redirected his life. "...It wasn't so long ago that I was spiraling downward in a lot of ways, until God touched my life and set me on the right track. I feel a huge debt to give glory back to Him for everything He has done for me," says Lang, who now finds himself healed of his addictions, walking with Jesus.

The reason why I want to tell you about this album is not to point out the dramatic shift in motivation, direction, and inspiration that this album has in comparison to Lang's previous work. In order to do that, I would have to give you a complete biography on Jonny Lang's musical journey, and my lack of attention to detail will only leave you confused.

The reason why I want to tell you about this album is because redemption really is true, and the message of redemption that permeates the lyrics, ideas, and soul of this album resonates in my heart. Maybe it will do the same for you.

In the album's single, which is getting a steady diet of radio play these days, Jonny pleads with the listener in a way that mirrors the pleadings of scripture, in Matthew 19:26 and Hebrews 12:1-2:

"Don't be deceived... it might not be easy, but anything's possible... your gonna make it if you try, keep your eye on the prize" (Anything's Possible).

Lang breathes some life into the spiritual discipline of prayer, a practice that those of us who've grown up in Christendom often grow weary of practicing:


"On my own I just can't get it right, it doesn't matter how hard I try... but with You. I become a much stronger man... getting on my knees puts me back on my feet again" (On My Feet Again).

There are many beautiful moments in the album, but the one that catches me by surprise every single time is the song "Only a Man". There is a simple call-andresponse moment near the end of the song as Jonny poses these questions:

"I'll give You my burdens, all of my desires... oh, what about these chains, Lord, they're so heavy... where do I go from here, Lord?" (Only a Man).


You must listen to this song. The answer comes and it is the beautiful truth of God's love, God's patience, God's promise, and the birth of His redemption that is made new in us each day.

In my garage last week, as I was listening to these songs, this thought crossed my mind, "Maybe You really mean it. Maybe all Your promises of redemption are true." And so, anywhere that I've had my iPod in tow spinning Jonny Lang's album Turn Around, I have remembered some things about God that I had grown



weary of remembering. Give it a listen. I promise that you will hear the heart and soul of our God in the heart and soul of Jonny Lang.  $\infty$

Steve remembers his first encounter with poverty when his dad brought him and his two brothers to the Minneapolis Revival Mission. Ten-year-old Steve didn't feel like spending a Friday night serving food to homeless people, but after he gave to others in need, he returned home feeling full and rich.

Another encounter with poverty was in his twenties when Steve became a Big Brother and friend to a fatherless, inner-city boy. Forty years later, Steve and Sam are still friends.

### You see, building deeply authentic, long-term relationships is what Steve Hanson's life is about.

He brought this concept into ministry as well. For the last two decades, Steve has established and developed long-term relationships throughout the world as Global Impact Pastor, and he has invited us along for the journey.



A fond memory Steve has, was when he carefully transported Raheem to the ocean pier. Together, they watched the seagulls, felt the gentle Caribbean breeze, and gazed into the wavy horizon. Raheem looked at Steve and said joyfully, "This is wonderful."

### 20 years in ministry

In 1985, Steve Hanson left a private practice in psychology and became the Youth Pastor at Open Door. He wanted Youth to experience something beyond a color television set and shopping malls. He wanted them to experience what he experienced in Haiti.

"I ruined these kids," he said, "in a positive way, by opening their eyes and ears to the faces and stories of poverty."

In 1987, Steve took the Youth to Haiti for the first Open Door short-term mission trip. He soon discovered that short-term mission trips are practical learning labs to test out authenticity, risk belonging, learn to love others who are different, and move beyond seeing a multitude of need to realizing that the faces of poverty have names with stories to tell.


Four years after working with the Youth, Steve was asked to become the first Mission Pastor at Open Door. His vision was - and continues to be - unconventional. In addition to supporting missionaries who serve in foreign places, he notices foreign places where God is already working and equips the native people with the resources they need to develop God's work. Then after a partnership has been established, he sends short-term mission teams from Open Door to participate in cross-cultural experiences.

These experiences help to strengthen relationships within our church body and across cultural lines. "Relationships grow in organic ways," Steve said, "meaning that they evolve on their own without constructing an agenda."

Among the 30 global and international partnerships, Open Door has been in relationships with Pastor Dio in Haiti for 17 years and Pastor Herdie in Belize for 15 years. A 16-year relationship with Steve Hass who is now the Vice President of World Vision led us to support HIV/AIDS in Africa through the Beyond Our Door special project.

"I feel like we've grown up with the people of Hopkins Village, Belize and Tricotte, Haiti," Steve said. "I like to stick with people for the long haul."

Reflecting over the last 20 years in ministry, Steve has gotten to know many names and faces beyond our door. Each one has a story, and Steve has invited us into their journey. He introduced us to the sunny smile of Raheem, a Belizean



boy with brittle-bone disease. While children his age play basketball, he's confined to a table and stares at the same four walls and ceiling every day. Through Project Mercy, Open Door children and adults compassionately raised a barrelload of coins; enough to build a safe brick home for Raheem's family of seven and a school for him and two other siblings with brittle-bone disease.

Another story is about Fanfan, a beautiful, young Haitian girl who was born with a mental disability. In Haiti, her condition is considered a voodoo curse. Fanfan's God-revering family was too embarrassed and hid her whenever any American stopped by for a visit. Five visits passed before the family trusted Steve enough to let Fanfan come out from hiding. In 2005-2006 more coins rolled in through Project Mercy to build a special-needs home where mentally disabled Haitians, like Fanfan, can live freely and be loved unashamed.

In Uganda, Steve introduced us to the blank, lifeless stare of a hopeless and disparaged African boy named Peter Katabazi. At the age of 13, he was left

to raise his four siblings after both parents died of HIV/AIDS. Through the Beyond Our Door special project, enough money was raised to build a safe, brick home with running water for Peter and his family. It replaced the mud hut they once lived in. In fact, in all, 38 homes have been built in the last three years through the generosity of the Open Door community.

In Northern Uganda we met a terrorized teenage boy named Innocent. He is one of thousands who have escaped the horrors of Lord's Resistance Army. The Beyond Our Door special project provides resources to World Vision that help restore these broken lives.

Getting to know the names and faces of the poor and building deeply authentic, long-term relationships with our partners are why Project Mercy and the Beyond Our Door special project work so well.

"But it's far more than a fund raising campaign," Steve said. "It's about making a difference in the lives of other human beings – getting to know their names and join their story."

So when Steve asks, "When do I ever 'feel' like being with the poor?" He just thinks back over the last 20 years of ministry at Open Door and smiles at all the faces, names, and stories that capture his memory within our doors and beyond.  $\infty$ 

### Faces within our door

In a church our size, it is easy to get lost in the crowd, but Steve Hanson has gotten to know many faces and names within our door over the last 20 years. Read on to what the Open Door community says about our pastor, mentor and friend...

I have logged thousands of miles traveling to the other side of the world with Steve Hanson. I know God has had a hand in having my path cross with his. He has been like an older brother to me – the one I never had but always wanted. He truly has an exceptional gift of just being with people and loving them. I have also appreciated getting to know the crazy side of Steve. I knew there was a "love connection" when I discovered early on Steve's sense of humor. 



We have been privileged to participate on six medical trips to Tricotte, Haiti with Steve. These have been precious times of sharing and doing life together.



We arrived in Haiti and boarded a large truck to begin a long, bumpy, and dusty journey to the village of Tricotte to hold a medical clinic. At the end of the day, I climbed down from the truck. Steve gave me a serious look and said "Judy, do something! DO SOMETHING WITH THAT HAIR!" When I looked in the mirror, I burst out laughing and understood his urgent request. My hair looked something like a dust mop!

When we ran the medical clinic in Tricotte numbers were given to the throngs of people waiting for the examining room. Each would be called in turn. Steve was the "keeper of the gate" to manage the crowd. One Mom pushed through with her toddler. The child appeared to have a large swelling on her face. Steve became quite concerned and moved her to the front of the line. The diagnosis? A piece of candy tucked inside her cheek. Steve's title was changed to "minister of triage!"

Steve has a great way of communicating with people. Everywhere we traveled, he conversed with the people. Steve sat on the school steps, at a family's table, and along village streets to wonder about their lives, children, and health. They knew Steve was listening. Sometimes he didn't know the language, but people knew that Steve cares. He doesn't need to preach to portray Jesus (although he does that well). Steve is present to the culture, to each person, and people see Jesus in him.

Being a missionary's child, I had a different concept of missions - the



more someone did, the more successful they would be. Numbers were important! How freeing it was for me to discover being present with people and letting God do the rest.

When I first came to Open Door I was hurting and found the services to be healing. But due to the size, it was hard to connect with others. I volunteered a lot and Steve's door was always open. He may never know how much that meant to me. For this I am thankful.

# A Brilliant Dance

### Talk about interesting dancing partners: my husband is an Owl and I am a Dolphin.

e learned this a couple of years ago, at Newly Marrieds – a gathering held for couples married five years or less. We all took a personality inventory, which revealed our general personality types. Among the types were the Owls and the Dolphins. We were separated into groups based on our likeness for a building project. My husband Ryan was in the Owl group. At the end of the allotted building time, the Owls had an intricate but disjointed construction. My Dolphin group had, well, not much of anything - we had spent most of our time chatting and sharing our ideas!

This was an epiphany for me. During disagreements and discussions, I had often wondered of my dear, sweet husband, What is wrong with him?!

This exercise made me realize that the very same thing was "wrong" with many of the other people in the group: they didn't think like I did! But the biggest realization I had was that most of the other couples weren't in the same personality group as their spouses...and it's a good thing. If I were exactly like Ryan, we'd both do a lot of planning but not much communicating. If he were just like me, we'd be very aware of each other's feelings and dreams, but we wouldn't get a whole lot accomplished. If we were the same, we both would lead and neither would follow.


Much of marriage is like this: learning to work with, and maybe even appreciate, the differences. Those who attended the recent Love & Respect Conference heard it referred to it as men and women wearing blue and pink headphones, respectively.

Through their headphones, they don't hear the same messages. Neither is inherently wrong; they're just different.

Mary Lou Fox leads one of the many Soul Mates marriage ministry groups at Open Door. She said, "Working and keeping your marriage together and learning new ways of dealing with each other have to be the hardest lessons to learn." But learning these lessons - to compromise and leave room for one another - can result in a beautiful dance.

As with any new skill, we learn this best from other people, receiving counsel from those who have figured it out and being present with those who are still studying. Getting involved in marriage ministry groups can aid in this learning curve. "It just might make your good marriage stronger, or it may provide the support you desperately need," said Mary Lou. Before You Say I Do facilitators, Ben and Ginny Quie, believe that this support is vital, "because there is so much joy and peace in a loving marriage and so much heartache and misery in a poor one. Simple as that."

One might think that, because I had this moment of realization, I am no longer dismayed by the fact that my husband cannot read my mind. Unfortunately, this isn't the case. But reading marriage



books, attending conferences, and enjoying community with other couples all serve as mini refresher courses in this complex choreography. And maybe someday, through God's grace and our commitment, we will dance gracefully, and experience the blessing of being an encouragement to others.

# Love and Respect

### "However, each one of you also must love his wife as he loves himself, and the wife must respect her husband" (Eph. 5:33).

don't want you to think Kim and I are marriage experts. Married seventeen years, we still have disagreements. We still disappoint each other. We still step on each other's words and thoughts. We still give each other cold shoulders, silent treatments, parting shots, and nasty looks.

However, we also love each other more. We respect each other more. We adore each other more. I am way into her more. The Love & Respect Conference served to confirm that we are perfectly normal. It affirmed what we do right. It challenged us where we fall short.

I will confess. I did not want to go. How could I maintain the image that we are a perfect couple if it were known that we attended a conference on marriage? Isn't it enough to say we were going to a "church thing"? People already accuse us of being big time church-goers. Do they need to know we are going to another church

thing that is also a marriage thing? So as much as I did not want to go I had no reasonable excuses.

I figured only couples in crises attended marriage conferences. Kim and I already had been fine tuning our communications with each other. I couldn't see how a conference could make a difference. Besides, I had better things to do with my weekend, like putts in the garage, go to the office, rake the yard.

The conference was highly recommended by Brad Friedlein, Adult Connections Pastor, and a few trusted friends. It was also what Kim wanted to do. One of her arguments for going was that it might be an opportunity to connect with other couples at Open Door – something we have wanted to do over our four years of attending. She knows me well. I acquiesced. But I wasn't about to make connections with couples whose marriages I assumed were train wrecks.

Please don't think ill of me, but here is what I did: I arrived, sat down, and looked around at the hundreds of couples. I tried to guess their stories. I tried to imagine the melt-down that brought these people to the point where they needed help. Kim was looking at all the couples who were just-like-us. I was looking at all the couples with suspicion.

Once the sessions began it did not take long for me to come to understand that the Love & Respect Conference is for any man and woman joined in marriage - not only couples in crisis. We had a good marriage going in. I am not bragging about my marriage, nor am I disillusioned. We know it's a good marriage because it's so much fun. But since the conference we have a more enriched marriage. We possess greater understanding of our core values.

Dr. Emerson Eggerichs begins by outlining the Crazy Cycle for us. Without love, wives react without respect - without respect, husbands react without love. Simply put, women seek love like they seek air to breath - men seek respect like they seek air to breath. When we fail to provide these for each other we risk suffocation in the Crazy Cycle.

Unless we do things purposely to move out of the Crazy Cycle, we will never get off the ride. Our deepest marital needs will never be met. We need to be willing to "decode" our spouses' words and come to a point where we trust their good will.

With the Energizing Cycle, his love motivates her respect. Her respect motivates his love. We were encouraged to try to see through the opposite pair of glasses. Emerson gave very practical ideas for how a husband can love his wife through "pink" megaphones, glasses, and hearing aids.

Emerson's wife, Sarah, shared similar insight with women about how to respect their husbands by acting, speaking, and listening with "blue" glasses, megaphones, and hearing aids. All throughout the conference we were reminded of the fact that neither of us are wrong, we are just different: "male (blue) and female (pink) He (purple) created them" (Gen. 1:27).

The strategies and stories shared were both helpful and humorous and helped us keep perspective in our union. For example, brand new infant girls make eye contact with adults and respond to conversation. Infant boys will first look toward the sound of the adult voice but then they will move their gaze to watch the mechanics of the spinning ceiling fan. Using these differences between the sexes Emerson helped us understand how we each hear and see and speak within the marriage. We were reminded that we (husband and wife) are wired vastly differently – that we need to communicate in ways that show love and respect, even when we do not feel loved or respected.

Since the conference Kim and I have found ourselves using one of his catch phrases on a number of occasions. If I feel disrespect, it has been useful to remember to frame my response thus: "that feels disrespectful, did I just come across as unloving?" Kim has been able to make use of the same tool: "that feels unloving, did I just say something disrespectful?" This has diffused many potential arguments.

Are we willing to commit to do as God commands regardless of the actions of our spouse? Not always easy, but necessary to experience the Rewarded Cycle.

Due to a prior commitment we had to leave the conference early. We missed the final session on the Rewarded Cycle (He loves regardless of her respect. She respects regardless of his love.) As we headed east on I-94 we recapped some of the presentation. We have applied much to our marriage, home and family and have drawn strength from the affirmations we received. We reflected on the lessons learned and connections made during the sessions.

I was engaged with her and showed it until a mint-condition-boat-tail-Buick-Riviera cruised passed us. As I gawked at the car, I realized I had begun to pull down my "blue" visor.


I reassured my wife with a lesson learned, "I'm listening honey, I'm just watching the ceiling fan."


What is your testimony?

Marriage: Reinforcing healthy Christian marriages and building places for fellowship and support. Men: Connecting with God and each other in honest and grace filled ways.


**Singles:** Connect in respectful and friendly ways through Bible studies, social activities and monthly potlucks.
